The Kennel Club becomes Royal: A new era for every dog in the UK

'21-dog salute' London, 25 November 2025

Following the honour of being granted the royal prefix by HRH King Charles III, it officially relaunches as the Royal Kennel Club (RKC).

To mark the occasion and to celebrate the enduring connection between the Royal Family, The Kennel Club and a national love of dogs, The Kennel Club commissioned a special '21-dog salute' outside Windsor Castle which features a royal line-up, including the King's favourite, a Jack Russell Terrier, Crufts legends, and even the current Dulux dog, all coming together to celebrate this momentous occasion. The dogs were all sourced from the Royal Kennel Club community with all participants volunteering their time, some travelling a long distance, to take part in the very special (and a little chaotic) photo shoot.

A census for every dog in Britain

The RKC is inviting every dog owner in Britain, regardless of breed, to take part in the UK's largest-ever Dog Census, a landmark project that will shape the future of dog health, ownership,

and wellbeing. The project will build on insights from the more than three million pedigree dogs already served by the organisation.

As the first major initiative of the RKC's new chapter, the Census will collect invaluable data on dogs' health, behaviour, lifestyle, and wellbeing, guiding scientific research, supporting new initiatives, and informing the development of services through the RKC and its year-round Crufts community.

Crufts: A year-round community for all dogs

For the first time, Crufts, the world's most famous dog show organised annually by the RKC, will evolve into a digital community accessible to all dogs and their owners. While the show remains a highlight, the new platform will operate year-round, meeting the needs of all dog owners through a range of new products and services, all designed to support dogs and their owners every day of the year. The platform will launch in February 2026, pre-registration opened on 25 November. For more information and to join the waiting list please visit: crufts.com/cruftsclub

Expanding decades of canine health expertise

Over its long history, the RKC has invested millions into research, education, and health programmes for pedigree dogs. The Health Test Results Finder, accessed by over 4 million people annually, helps owners and breeders make informed decisions, while the organisation's comprehensive evidence base draws on over 4,000 research papers across 222 breeds. These resources, including more than 1.5 million screening results covering hip, elbow, eye, heart, spinal, and respiratory conditions, and over 100 DNA tests, will now benefit all dogs in the UK.

Further to this, building on the Health Standard for pedigree dogs introduced this year, the RKC will also extend this guidance to non-pedigree dogs in 2026, helping breeders make evidence-based decisions ahead of breeding that protect canine health and wellbeing.

Official international health scheme results can now be recorded on our database and displayed on Health Test Result Finder as "Test result with owner".

To be eligible for review, results must:
• Be issued by an official international screening scheme

- Relate to a condition listed on the Health Standard
- Use a screening method comparable to the UK equivalent scheme
- Include the dog's Royal Kennel Club registered name or number and microchip number

The Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club celebrates 150 years

The Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club (DDTC) hosted a landmark 150th anniversary breed celebration lunch at the Royal Kennel Club, Clarges Street on Monday 17 November 2025, honouring a century and a half of dedication to one of Britain's most cherished - and most vulnerable - native dog breeds.

An iconic Scottish dog, with particularly expressive eyes and distinctive soft silky hair on the top of their heads, Dandie Dinmonts are intelligent and determined, but are also sensitive and affectionate.

This milestone event crowns a remarkable year of advocacy, education,



and celebration for the DDTC, the second-oldest breed club in the world, as it continues its mission to protect and promote the endangered Dandie Dinmont Terrier.

A year of highlights for the Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club included:

January: Launch of a limited-edition calendar celebrating the breed's rich heritage.

April & May: Successful open and championship shows at Staffordshire County Showground, judged by international breed specialists, Jonas Wiborg (Sweden) and Joan Glen Tinsley (UK), with entries of 55 and 45 respectively.

June: A weekend of festivities in the Scottish Borders - the breed's ancestral home - including the 10th annual Dandie Derby, heritage walks, lectures, and the unveiling of the penultimate plaque on the Dandie Dinmont Heritage Trail.

Cultural moments: Selkirk Distillers launched a commemorative Dandie Dinmont Gin, and Bowhill House hosted a display of breed artwork and history.

Paul Eardley, Chairman of the DDTC said: "Celebrating 150 years is not just about honouring our past - it's about

securing the future of this extraordinary breed. The Dandie Dinmont Terrier is a living link to British canine heritage, and we're proud to champion its preservation."

With fewer than 100 puppies registered annually in the UK, the Dandie Dinmont remains on the Royal Kennel Club's list of vulnerable British and Irish native breeds. The DDTC's tireless efforts - from international collaboration to public education - aim to reverse this trend and ensure the breed thrives for generations to come.

Dandie Dinmont Terriers are small but strong dogs that are independent and highly intelligent. They enjoy exercise as well as their alone time and make a great companion for anyone living in a city or the countryside, looking for an even-tempered four-legged companion.

Independent Review Panel appointed to oversee JEP reform

The Royal Kennel Club has appointed an independent Review Panel to lead a comprehensive evaluation of the Judges Education Programme (JEP), which has represented one of the most significant changes to judge training and progression in the UK in recent decades.

The Review Panel has now convened and will assess how well the programme is meeting its objectives of improving judging standards, supporting breed education, and preparing competent and confident judges for the future.

The appointment of the Review Panel follows an open call for volunteers, which attracted 75 applications. The selection process was anonymised and independently scored, with shortlisted candidates interviewed by David Craig, Board Member, Roger Perkins, Chair of the Risk and Audit Committee, and Barry Jones, Judges Education Manager.

The Review Panel will be chaired by David Craig. Its members are:

Barry Jones, Judges Education Manager at the Royal Kennel Club, will support the panel in an advisory capacity.

Panel members bring a wide range of experience across judging, exhibiting, breeding, breed education, mentoring, observing and show organisation. They also bring professional expertise in adult learning, assessment, verification and quality assurance.

The Review Panel's work is scheduled to conclude in early 2026. Its findings and recommendations will be published in full.

The JEP, introduced in 2021, is designed to support judges from entry level through to Best in Show at general championship level. It replaces the previous system with a structured,

six-level framework that allows judges to progress at their own pace. As the final transitional routes come to an end, including A2 and Grandfathering by 31 December 2025, the JEP will soon become the sole route for judging progression.

Since its launch, the JEP has delivered 16 Eye for a Dog assessments and 40 Breed Specific Assessments, with pass rates of 64 percent and 58 percent respectively. As the JEP becomes the only route for progression, demand for assessments is expected to increase. The Royal Kennel Club is using its experience to date to inform future planning, including the frequency and location of assessments.

As Ian Seath has acknowledged in previous speeches, the JEP has prompted passionate debate. The review is an opportunity to listen, reflect and improve. The Royal Kennel Club welcomes feedback from all those involved in judging and education.

A landmark SGM signals renewal and resolve at the Royal Kennel Club

The Royal Kennel Club has marked a pivotal moment in its journey towards financial sustainability and organisational renewal with a highly successful Special General Meeting (SGM) held on Wednesday 19 November.

This was an SGM of firsts: the first under Chairman Ian Seath, now in his fifth month since being elected shortly after the Annual General Meeting, and the first to be hosted in-house at Clarges Street, with 75 Members in attendance, and the first look at the organisation's new visual identity. The event drew strong member engagement and delivered clear outcomes, including overwhelming support for governance reforms.

Andrew Lawson, the Royal Kennel Club's Chief Financial Officer, presented a detailed overview of the most extensive financial review in the Royal Kennel Club's history, and the corrective actions now underway. Set against the backdrop of the continuing year-on-year decline in breed registrations, the accounts show a £4.29 million loss for 2024, but also mark a turning point, with a 'clean audit', no evidence of fraud, and a clear path to recovery.

Jannine Edgar, Chief Executive of the Royal Kennel Club, shared progress to date against the 2025 business plan, building on information presented at

the AGM earlier this year. She outlined the Royal Kennel Club's commitment to reach breakeven by 2026 and deliver a consistent £5 million surplus by 2030, enabling reinvestment into dogs, grassroots, and wellbeing. She also previewed the Royal Kennel Club's brand refresh, which will help expand its reach and relevance among more dog owners. This is the most significant transformation in the organisation's history, honouring its rich heritage, while expanding its focus from pedigree dogs to all dogs across the UK.

Highlights include:

- **A new visual identity featuring the Royal prefix granted by His Majesty King Charles III**
- **A new Crufts Club launching in 2026, with pre-registration opening next week**
- **Expanded health and wellbeing programmes for every dog**

The meeting also confirmed that Emblehope and Burngrange Estate is under offer, with the sale expected to deliver a profit and strengthen the Club's financial position. Updates were also shared on committee appointments, rule amendments, and the evolving Membership model, all aimed at improving transparency and accountability. With reference to the Royal Kennel Club's work to improve governance, Vice Chairman Paul Eardley offered an update on the governance

review and next steps, while Louise Paterson, on behalf of the Club Committee introduced a proposal for a new Membership model. These will be shared with Members in due course for their consideration and feedback.

There was one voting item on the agenda: a series of A Rules amendments forming part of the wider Governance Review. With a two-thirds majority required, the motion was comfortably carried with 530 votes for, 31 against, and 24 abstentions, representing 94.5 percent support.

The meeting closed with Chairman Ian Seath signing the Royal Kennel Club's new 'Pledge to sportsmanship, civility, fairness and respect' and inviting Members to do the same. Ian is a passionate advocate for kindness and respect, and the Pledge marks a visible commitment to a high standard of conduct across the dog owning community.

Ian Seath, Chairman, on behalf of the Board wishes to thank all Members who voted by proxy or in person, as well as everyone who helped deliver a well-run event. The organisation looks ahead with confidence, unity and renewed purpose.

Breeder mentoring and canine midwifery initiative launched

We were proud to launch the Royal Kennel Club's Breeder Mentoring & Canine Midwifery Programme last month, a pioneering initiative developed in collaboration with ROYAL CANIN® and James Wellbeloved™.

This programme was designed to connect experienced breeders with those just beginning their journey, fostering confidence, promoting responsible breeding practices, and strengthening our breeder community.

Applications were invited from seasoned breeders to serve as mentors - trusted peers and "canine midwives" - who would share practical, hands-on experience from planning matings and whelping to the realities of rearing a litter. While mentors were not expected to replace veterinary or legal professionals, they provided invaluable guidance rooted in lived experience.

Selected mentors were also invited to attend our inaugural Canine Midwifery Day at the Waltham Petcare Science Institute on 2 December 2025, where they will contribute to shaping and co-designing the future of this initiative.

Thank you to everyone who helped spread the word and encouraged outstanding breeders to get involved. Together, we've taken a meaningful step toward supporting the next generation of responsible breeders.

Webinar: Understanding congenital heart disease in dogs

In partnership with the Veterinary Cardiovascular Society (VCS), the Royal Kennel Club's Health team invited breeders, owners and veterinary professionals last month to join the third webinar in its specialist canine heart health series. The webinar is available to watch on the Royal Kennel Club's YouTube channel.

This free session, led by cardiologist specialist and VCS member, Dr Chris Linney, took a detailed look at congenital heart disease – building on the insights from the previous **introductory webinar**, presented by Dr Hannah Stephenson, and **acquired heart disease webinar**, presented by Dr Emily Dutton.

Dr Linney explored the types, causes and clinical presentation of congenital heart conditions, alongside diagnostic approaches, treatment pathways and emerging research opportunities. The webinar also include a one-hour presentation followed by a 30-minute question and answer session.

Dr Chris Linney, who is currently the clinical lead and Head of the Cardiology team at Paragon Veterinary Referral and has recently become

a Fellow of the Royal College of Veterinary, the highest recognition for contributions to clinical practice, said: "Congenital heart disease remains a significant challenge in canine health, but with increasing awareness and better diagnostic tools, we're able to identify and manage these conditions earlier and more effectively. This webinar was an opportunity to deepen understanding – not just of the diseases themselves, but of how breeders, vets and owners can work together to support affected dogs and improve outcomes for future generations."

The Royal Kennel Club's health-focused webinar series has covered a wide range of topics, including bloat, epilepsy, colour dilution alopecia, osteosarcoma, haemangiosarcoma, and the science of DNA testing for health. These sessions aim to increase awareness, share the latest research, and foster collaboration between experts, researchers, breeders and owners to improve the long-term health and wellbeing of dogs.

The judge of the Junior Warrant final at Crufts 2026 will be Rony Doedijns (the Netherlands) and will take place on Thursday 5 March 2026.

The Junior Warrant is an award for pedigree dogs from the ages of six to 18 months which have won a series of first prizes at both open and championship shows. Achieving a Junior Warrant is one of the highest levels of success for young pedigree dogs.

The Royal Kennel Club Junior Warrant Winner of the Year competition is held annually and is for dogs which have gained the title of Junior Warrant during the previous year. The final will be just one of the many activities taking place at Crufts, from 5-8 March 2026 at the NEC, Birmingham.

Teenager from Cambridgeshire wins National Junior Handler of the Year title

A teenager from Cambridgeshire has been awarded the title of National Junior Handler of the Year, and will represent the UK at the Joe Cartledge Memorial International Junior Handling final at Crufts 2026 and in the junior handling final at the World Dog Show in Italy 2026.

Megan Slack, aged 17, from Wisbech was awarded the top spot by judge Kirsty Ryan, at the prestigious final, organised by the Junior Handling Association (JHA), alongside her Portuguese Water Dog called Hudson (Multi Ch Macduff's Critical Acclaim Imp Can) who she co-owns with Byron Williams and Glenda Newton.

The event took place alongside the Royal Kennel Club's Junior Warrant of the Year semi-final, both held at The Royal Kennel Club Building in Warwickshire on Saturday 18 October 2025. Megan has been a Young Kennel Club (YKC) member for 8 years, was runner up National Junior Handler of the Year in 2024 and runner up YKC Show Handler of the Year at Crufts in 2024. She will now represent the UK at the Joe Cartledge Memorial International Junior Handling Final held at Crufts 2026, on Friday 6 March, where the judge will be Jason Lynn.

In the second part of the competition, the top six competitors were given a Flat Coated Retriever to handle, with Megan handling four-year-old Bonnie (Sh Ch Moontorn Better Half Of Me JW OSW). The Kennel Club and JHA would like to thank the owners of these Flat Coated Retrievers for lending their dogs - Abby Bellamy and Dawn Warrington.

Commenting on her win, Megan said: "I am absolutely over the moon, winning the finals really is a dream come true. The feeling of representing the UK in a hobby I love so much really does mean the world to me. I feel so excited to be in the big ring at Crufts! I cannot thank my friends and family enough for all the support they have given me over the years. Of course a huge thank you to the judge Mrs Kirsty Ryan for thinking so highly of Hudson and me."

Megan won her spot in the final by winning first place at the JHA semi-final heat in July 2025 at National Working & Pastoral Breeds Society, held at Three Counties Showground in Malvern, under

judge, Jodi Allen. It was Megan's fourth time reaching the finals.

Megan wants to be a canine hydrotherapist and she trains at Top Flight Dog Training Club. Her favourite hobby is dog showing. In her spare time, she plays tennis with her granddad weekly. She's also a keen crocheter and enjoys making animals and presents for people.

The National Junior Handler of the Year final, organised by the Junior Handling Association, has been running since the 1970s and is one of the most hotly contested junior handling finals in the country. The semi-final heats for the 2025 competition took place between December 2024 and August 2025 and more than 150 junior handlers competed in these classes at the national group championship shows.

Changes to Dog Showing Regulations for 2026

The Royal Kennel Club has approved the following changes to the regulations for dog shows held under F Regulations with effect from 1 January 2026.

The following amendment to the regulation allows dog show societies to accept Not for Competition (NFC) entries for dogs of 12 weeks of age and over, this aligns with the regulations for activity disciplines.

Amendment to regulation F.1.c

Regulation F.1.c. Application.

TO:

Only dogs of four calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Royal Kennel Club licensed shows. However, societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion **for dogs aged 12 weeks and over.**

(Insertion in bold)

(Effective 1 January 2026)

The following amendment to the regulation is to provide clarity that Reserve Challenge Certificates (RCCs) do not count towards Champion titles until five have been gained.

Amendment to Regulation F.4 and F(A)8

Regulation F.4. Licensed shows.

TO:

F.4. *Dogs which have won a Challenge Certificate, **five Reserve Challenge Certificates (under different judges)** or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club e.g. CACIB, CAC, Green Star are not eligible for entry at these Shows, except for in the open class at breed club limited shows for Imported Register Breeds and breeds not allocated championship status in the United Kingdom.

(Insertion in bold)

(Effective 1 January 2026)

Regulation F(A)8.

TO:

F(A)8. - No dog is eligible for exhibition at a Limited Show which has won a Challenge Certificate, **five Reserve Challenge Certificates (under different judges)** or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion, **excluding Reserve Challenge Certificates**, under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club e.g. CACIB, CAC, Green Star, with the exception of the open class at breed club limited shows for Imported Register Breeds and breeds not allocated championship status in the United Kingdom.

(Insertion in bold, deletions struck through)

(Effective 1 January 2026)

The below amendments to the regulations have been approved following a review of the regulations for Matches and Special Events.

Amendment to Regulation F(2)

Regulation F(2)

TO:

Match Regulations

1. A match is a form of competition where judging is

by elimination one against one. A match may be intra-club or an inter-club competition between **Royal Kennel Club Registered** societies.

2. A **Royal Kennel Club Registered** society may hold up to 12 matches per annum. In the case of clubs which have registered branches, each branch may hold one match per calendar month.
3. **Application:** Application for authority to hold matches is to be included within the annual returns required under Regulation C.4.a.(1). Separate applications to The Royal Kennel Club for each match is not required. **No fee is payable for matches.**
4. On the day of the event a current public liability insurance document must be held **by the Organisers.** or the event will be deemed to be unrecognised.
5. **Exhibits must be in the registered ownership of one of the members of one of the societies competing in the match. In the case of a dog owned in partnership, each member of such partnership must, at the time of entry, be a member of one of the societies competing in the match.**
6. **Puppies 4 months of age and over may compete in a match.**
7. Dogs, which have won a Challenge Certificate, **5 Reserve Challenge Certificates (under different judges)** or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion, **excluding Reserve Challenge Certificates**, under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club, are not eligible for entry in matches. However, they are allowed to attend the match and enter a special class restricted to only dogs that have won a Challenge Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion. The winner cannot compete for Best in Match or Best Puppy in Match.

Special Event Regulations

8. **Special Events are designated as any breed show related event which cannot be included on the schedule of a normally licensed show due to being invitational and therefore not open to all competitors, or which are not being held at a licensed show. Where competitors qualify for a final via heats held at that and other shows, special event permission must be sought for the final whether it is held in conjunction with a licensed show or as a separate standalone event.**
9. **The regulations relating to the disqualification and forfeit of awards will apply to these events.**
10. **Application for permission to hold a special event may be made by any Royal Kennel Club Registered General or Breed Society. A separate application to The Royal Kennel Club for each special event must be made with the appropriate fee.**
11. **On the day of the event a current public liability insurance document must be held by the Organisers.**

General Regulations for Matches and Special Events

12. **Jurisdiction and responsibilities:** The Officers and Committee Members of the organising society will jointly and severally be liable for the organisation of the Match **or Special Event** and **ensuring** that it is run under the rules and regulations of The Royal Kennel Club.
13. **Regulations:**

13. A dog must at the time of entry for a match be

solely and unconditionally the property of the exhibitor and must, at the time of competition, be registered in the exhibitor's name at The Royal Kennel Club.

14. Separate entry forms must be completed for each exhibitor and must be signed by the exhibitor or his/her authorised agent.
15. The committee of the society may reserve the right to refuse any entry on reasonable grounds.
16. Exhibits must be the property of the members of one of the societies competing in the match. In the case of a dog owned in partnership, each member of such partnership must, at the time of entry, be a member of one of the societies competing in the match.
17. If a dog competes which has been exposed to the risk of any contagious or infectious disease during the period of 21 days prior to a match **or special event** and/or if any dog shall be proved to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, including contagious results of inoculation against distemper, at a match **or special event**, the owner thereof shall be liable to be dealt with under Royal Kennel Club Rule A11.
18. Dogs, which have won a Challenge Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion, **excluding Reserve Challenge Certificates**, under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Royal Kennel Club, are not eligible for entry in matches. However, they are allowed to attend the match and enter a special class restricted to only dogs that have won a Challenge Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion. The winner cannot compete for Best in Match or Best Puppy in Match.
19. Not more than 64 dogs may compete at a match.
20. Prize cards, diplomas, rosettes and other printed awards may be awarded at matches but they must be overprinted 'match'.
21. Societies are permitted to present special prizes at matches.
22. A society shall keep a list of the names of all competing dogs with awards, and the names and addresses of the owners for a period of twelve months from the date of the matches **or special event**.

(Insertions in bold, deletions struck through)
(effective 1 January 2026)

The following amendment to the regulations removes the requirement for benching and permits societies choose whether to provide benching or not.

Amendment to Regulations F(1)4 and F(1)16

Regulation F(1)4. Benching.

TO:

F(1)4 Benching

Championship, open and limited shows:-

- Benching **may** must be provided by the show society and exhibits must be benched in a manner which has been approved by the Board **unless exemption from benching has been granted by the Board.**
- If **provided** benches must be constructed of materials which can be easily cleaned and

disinfected. They must be of such design and construction as to provide reasonable comfort and security to dogs for the duration of the show. Arrangements must be made for the secure fastening of the dogs on the benches.

In certain cases the Board may, on application, authorise exemption from standard benching: (Insertions in bold, deletions struck through) (Effective 1 January 2026)

Regulation (F)(1)16. Exhibition of dogs.

TO:

(F)(1)16. Exhibition of dogs. Championship, Open and Limited Shows (Benching):-

- (1) Dogs should be present on their benches at all times except
 - (a) When being judged;
 - (b) When being prepared for exhibition and/or being exercised;
- (2) In certain circumstances dogs must be present on their benches at all times if required by show management
- (3) Dogs may be removed from their benches by order of the veterinary surgeon or show management:

(renumber accordingly)
(Deletions struck through)
(Effective 1 January 2026)

The below regulations relating to partnership shows have been removed, after a successful two year suspension trial period from 1 January 2024.

Removal of Regulations F(1)20.h and F(1)30.a.(10)

Regulation F(1)20.h.

F(1)20.h

At partnership shows judges must not officiate at one show and enter or handle a dog for exhibition at the other show including exhibiting a different breed on another day to that which they are to judge. Partnership shows are defined as shows where the host club and other clubs share a venue and other facilities to allow exhibitors the opportunity to exhibit at each show.

(Deletions struck through)
(Effective 1 January 2026)

Regulation F(1)30.a.(10)

F(1)30.a.(10)

A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proven amongst other things to have been: (10) Entered for competition and/or handled in the ring by the judge a partnership show even if the class or classes are on another day of the show or the entry is for a different breed to that which the person is to judge.

(Deletions struck through)
(Effective 1 January 2026)

The below amendment to the regulations has been introduced to confirm which dog can be declared Best Veteran in Breed and subsequently Best Veteran in Group and Best Veteran in Show.

Addition of Regulation F(1)27

Regulation F(1)27. Best Veteran in Show.

TO:

27. Best Veteran in Show.

Where a Best Veteran in Show competition is

scheduled the Best Veteran in Show is a Veteran which has been declared Best Veteran in Breed or Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran is a dog of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the show.

a. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a Veteran it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Veteran in Breed, Best Veteran in Group or Best Veteran in Show respectively.

b. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a Veteran it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Veteran in Breed, Best Veteran in Group or Best Veteran in Show respectively.

c. Shows judged on the group system (Definition: Shows judged on the Group System-Refer Regulation F(1)26.b.).

(1) Best Veteran in Breed

A Best Veteran may be declared in each breed from veterans entered in the breed classes.

(2) Best Veteran in Group

Best Veteran in Group and subsequent veteran group placings must be selected from:-

(a) Those veterans declared Best Veteran in Breed.

(b) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group.

(c) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group.

d. Shows not judged on the group system

(1) At championship and open shows, Best Veteran in Show and subsequent placings must be selected from:

(a) Those veterans declared Best Veteran in Breed.

(b) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group.

(c) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group.

(2) At limited shows, Best Veteran in Show and subsequent placings must be selected from:

(a) Those veterans declared Best Veteran in Breed.

(b) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes.

(c) The veteran declared Best Veteran from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes.

e. Best Veteran in Show

Best Veteran in Show must be selected from the Best Veteran in Group winners.

(Insertions in bold)

(Effective from 1 January 2026)

(Subsequent regulations to be renumbered)

The following amendments to the regulations have been approved to bring these judges regulations in line with the Judges Education Programme.

Amendment to Regulation F(1)20 and F(1)22.d

Regulation F(1)20. Judges and Judging.

TO:

F(1)20. Judges and Judging

a. General canine society, affiliated societies and breed club championship, open and limited shows

1. Championship Shows

For non Challenge Certificate breeds at championship shows the selected judge must, when appointed by the club/society, either:

a. have previously been approved to award Challenge Certificates or be listed at Judges Education Programme Level 2 or above for the relevant breed and not have been declared ineligible to do so by the time of carrying out the appointment.

b. Be included on a Breed Council/Club B judges list or above and be listed at Judges Education Programme Level 1.

2. Open and Limited Shows

a. For open and limited shows scheduling more than three breed classes (four if including a Puppy class) for a particular breed the selected judge must, when appointed by the club/society, either:

(i) Have previously been approved to award Challenge Certificates or be listed at Judges Education Programme Level 2 or above for the relevant breed

(ii) Be included on a Breed Council/Club B judges list or above.

b. For open and limited shows scheduling up to three classes (four if scheduling a Puppy class) for a particular breed, the selected judge must, when appointed by the club/society, be listed at Judges Education Programme Level 1

ii. Have met the Judges Education Programme Level 1 criteria at the time of accepting the appointment.

Except:-

i. Judges resident in Northern Ireland. Persons who are approved to award Green Stars under Irish Kennel Club Rules and are resident in Northern Ireland are permitted to judge **up to three classes (four if scheduling a Puppy class) for the relevant breed at open or limited shows** the above mentioned classes at Kennel Club licensed Championship and open shows held in Northern Ireland, without being included on a Breed Council/Club judges list.

ii. Overseas judges. For non Challenge Certificate breeds at championship shows and for open and limited shows scheduling more than three classes (four if scheduling a Puppy class) for a particular breed the organising club/society must ensure any overseas judge appointed to judge has been:

a. Approved to judge the breed concerned at championship level in the country in which they are domiciled, or

b. Listed at Judges Education Programme Level 2 or above for the breed concerned

c. Are on a Royal Kennel Club registered breed club/council B-list or above and be listed at Judges Education Programme Level 1.

(c) On accepting an appointment the selected judge must ensure that their name is included on a relevant breed club/council judges list or at the appropriate level of the Judges Education Programme.

(Insertion in bold. Deletions struck through)
(Effective from 1 January 2026)

Regulation F(1)22. Selection, Appointment and Eligibility to Judge.

TO:

22. Selection, Appointment and Eligibility to Judge.

d. Application for approval of judge

The show society must apply to the Board for the approval of the following judges with the following conditions:

1. All applications for the approval to judge with Challenge Certificates, Groups, Best in Show, and Referees, **must include both the nomination and the questionnaire (where required)**, and must be lodged by the show society with the Secretary of The Royal Kennel Club at least 12 months prior to the date of the show on the form provided.

(Deletions struck through)

(Effective from 1 January 2026)

Changes to Field Trial Regulations for 2026

Regulation J4.c.(4)

TO:

The secretary of the society shall send a copy of the schedule and entry form to The Royal Kennel Club **within three days of printing if requested**.

(Deletion struck through) (Insertion in bold)

(Effective 2 February 2026)

Regulation J12.a.(6)

TO:

To have been handled at a trial, boarded or prepared for competition by one of the scheduled judges within the previous twelve months prior to the trial **or by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family or is resident at the same address as the scheduled judge within the previous twelve months prior to the trial**. This provision does not apply to judges appointed in an emergency **or at any Field Trial Championship or Champion Stake**.

(Insertion in Bold. Deletion struck through.)

(Effective from 2 February 2026)

Regulation J(A)3.m.

TO:

At the end of each retrieve or run, Judges are advised to place each dog in a category such as A or B (+ or -) according to the work done. Such gradings may, quite properly, be supplemented on occasion by additional notation for reference purposes when Judges are going through their books. It is, however, imperative to appreciate that gradings **must** **should** never be retrospectively adjusted **once agreed with all judges and written in the grid**. Neither should there ever be any attempt to sum sequences of grades to produce a single letter grading of a dog. When all dogs have been seen by a Judge, or Judges, they will wish to confer to determine which dogs they wish to discard or retain; it is vitally important for Judges to make short notes of each dog's work. Judges should never expect to be able to trust to memory.

Judges should always satisfy themselves that the damage done has been caused by the dog, not by the shot or fall. Judges, for instance, must be clear about the difference between damage to the ribcage caused by shot and the quite distinctive damage caused by a dog.

Kennel Club Rule A11

The Committee having carefully considered the evidence, find that the complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Mr Michael Craig namely that he behaved discreditably or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in that he made inappropriate sexual, and racist comments and was threatening towards Mrs Christina Wong-Curley at Crufts on 7 March 2025, is upheld.

The Committee impose the following penalties:

1. To warn him as to his future conduct [A11 j (1)]
2. To censure him [A11 j (2)]
3. To fine him £300.00 [A11 j (3)]
4. To disqualify him from exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Kennel Club. If any person disqualified under this sub-paragraph shall attend any canine event whilst disqualified the Board shall have the power to increase the period of disqualification [A11 j (4)]
5. To disqualify him from being or becoming a member of any canine club or society registered with or affiliated to the Kennel Club [A11 j (5)]
6. To disqualify him from acting as an officer or serving on the committee of any canine society [A11 j (6)]
7. To disqualify him from taking part in the management of any event licensed by The Royal Kennel Club [A11 j (7)]
8. To disqualify him from judging at any event licensed by the Kennel Club [A11 j (8)]

The suspensions and disqualifications are to be for the period of six (6) months from 25 September 2025. Additionally, the Committee determined that Mr Craig should be subject to a Yellow card which will take effect from the expiry of his disqualification for an ensuing period of 12 months from 25 March 2026.

The Committee, following the imposition of these penalties, would draw the attention of the Respondent to the effect of Rule A11 sub-sections 1 and n.

The Committee understood that the parties had a previous professional relationship (Mr Craig handling dogs) which had clearly broken down.

The Committee's focus is not on the personal disputes but on the incident in question.

There is reference to an earlier incident at the Ladies Kennel Association Championship Show in December 2024 – however the Committee focused on the later more severe incident at Crufts and that is the context for this decision.

Mr Craig did not participate in the process, until very late in the day and with last minute responses – despite having lodged his own complaint in the matter. Both parties have a very different perspective and account for the incident at Crufts. The Committee has reviewed the accounts given.

Private disputes and tensions do not belong in licensed events – and certainly not at Crufts – time and again the advice given is do not bring private matters to a licensed event. It can only lead to

unmanageable confrontations – which are not acceptable but should not form the basis for a formal disciplinary complaint unless the boundary of behaviours is crossed.

This incident did cross that boundary and due reflection must be given to the incident.

The penalty imposed is intended to reflect that the behaviour exhibited was considered to be wholly unacceptable in the context of Kennel Club licensed events. The Committee noted that the incident went beyond a heated argument and the language used by Mr Craig was vicious and highly offensive. It is never acceptable in any circumstances to be verbally abusive and engage in a confrontational and threatening manner in the context of a licensed event (or indeed otherwise).

The Disciplinary Committee is frustrated that licensed events are still marred and disrupted by this type of incident. The Committee will continue to accelerate penalties to drive home the message that a licensed event is not the place for private disputes or tensions between people. If there are private issues between parties, then that should be addressed outside the context of a licensed event – the only appropriate reaction within a licensed event is to walk away but never to solicit or engage in direct challenge or confrontation.

Appeals Tribunal

Mr Michael Craig

Kennel Club Rule A11

24 October 2025

1. This is an appeal from the Disciplinary Committee decision of 25 September 2025.

The Committee upheld a complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Mr Michael Craig that he behaved discreditably or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in that he made inappropriate sexual, and racist comments and was threatening towards an exhibitor at Crufts on 7 March 2025.

The Committee issued a warning, censure and imposed a fine of £300.

2. Disqualifications were imposed from activities including exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Kennel Club for period of six (6) months from 25 September 2025. Additionally, the Committee determined that Mr Craig should be subject to a Yellow card which will take effect from the expiry of his disqualification for an ensuing period of 12 months from 25 March 2026.
3. The grounds raised for appeal by Mr Craig:
 - i) This was a vexatious and malicious allegation and alludes to the dispute following a timing clash of judging at Crufts and that Mr Craig could not show in the booked class for an exhibitor.
 - ii) References are made to issues arising at Ladies Kennel Association in December 2024 between the parties and that the police took no action (in respect of complaints made about Mr Craig).
 - iii) Impact of the penalty which is causing loss of earnings reputational harm and emotional distress.
 - iv) Injury to feelings and loss of livelihood contrary to the Equality Act 2010.
 - v) Factors of Mr Craig's neurodivergent diagnosis not taken into account.

4. The Appeals Tribunal have reviewed this matter on an expedited basis due to the representations in terms of livelihood and impact on income. No actual details have been provided of the loss of income but it is understood that Mr Craig offers professional handling for exhibitors at Kennel Club licensed events and derives an income from that activity.

5. The Disciplinary Committee was focused on the complaint about Mr Craig's engagement with the exhibitor at Crufts. The earlier incident at Ladies Kennel Association was a prelude to but was not an issue upon which the decision was made.

Whether or not the police reviewed and did not take action for any of the matters complained of does not preclude the Kennel Club from looking at the complaint through the disciplinary lens and the impact upon the canine world governed by the Kennel Club.

Mr Craig did not participate in the disciplinary proceedings until the very last moment just before the initial scheduled hearing. The matter was deferred to allow further submissions to be made.

6. There is a clear acknowledgement of the incident and that comments were made as complained of. Obviously and inevitably both parties have different accounts and perception of the same incident.

7. The Disciplinary Committee made its views very plain; Private disputes and tensions do not belong in licensed events – and certainly not at Crufts – time and again the advice given is do not bring private matters to a licensed event. It can only lead to unmanageable confrontations – which are not acceptable but should not form the basis for a formal disciplinary complaint unless the boundary of behaviours is crossed.

This incident did cross that boundary and due reflection must be given to the incident.

The penalty imposed is intended to reflect that the behaviour exhibited was considered to be wholly unacceptable in the context of Kennel Club licensed events. The Committee noted that the incident went beyond a heated argument and the language used by Mr Craig was vicious and highly offensive. It is never acceptable in any circumstances to be verbally abusive and engage in a confrontational and threatening manner in the context of a licensed event (or indeed otherwise).

The Disciplinary Committee is frustrated that licensed events are still marred and disrupted by this type of incident. The Committee will continue to accelerate penalties to drive home the message that a licensed event is not the place for private disputes or tensions between people. If there are private issues between parties, then that should be addressed outside the context of a licensed event – the only appropriate reaction within a licensed event is to walk away but never to solicit or engage in direct challenge or confrontation.

Observations and Outcome

8. Mr Craig does not seem to accept or appreciate the impact of the behaviours complained of and which are not acceptable in the licensed event environment.

Crufts is a prestige event - a public and family event. It is understood that Mr Craig's evidence

shows that he is an experienced professional handler deriving an income from handling. It is of concern that there has not been any sign of contrition, and Mr Craig does not appear to understand that as a professional handler he should hold himself to a higher standard than that of an ordinary exhibitor.

As a professional handler there has to be a degree of personal responsibility in that if income is derived from handling and showing then it is of even greater importance to maintain a distance from confrontation and to not engage in behaviours that may lead to complaint and potential sanction.

9. Mr Craig alludes to a neurodivergent diagnosis. The Kennel Club will always seek to make any requisite and reasonable adjustments to the regulatory processes. It does not absolve behaviour that crosses a threshold in the context of a licensed event. It is up to the individual to manage such factors – and cannot be a mitigation for behaviour which crosses the line of reasonable engagement.
10. The Appeals Tribunal did review carefully the level of penalty and was not of the view that it was unreasonable and therefore did not require withdrawal or modification.
11. The Appeals Tribunal did not see any ground for appeal and accordingly the appeal is not upheld.
12. The volume and strength of character testimonials and client references provided on Mr Craig's behalf was also noted, and the personal regard in which Mr Craig is held is commendable. Nevertheless, it must be recognised that positive personal relationships cannot outweigh the standards of conduct required in public or regulated environments. There must now be a clear and demonstrable shift in understanding what behaviour falls within acceptable boundaries and what does not. Going forward, any departure from those standards will be met with a firm and proportionate response, reflecting the seriousness with which such matters are regarded.

The Committee having carefully considered the evidence, find that the complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Ms Diane Culverhouse namely that she behaved discreditably or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in that she impugned the judge's decision and verbally abused and was threatening towards another exhibitor following the judging of Lhasa Apso at Blackpool & District Canine Society Championship Show on 20 June 2025, is upheld.

The Committee impose the following penalties:

1. To warn her as to her future conduct [A11 j (1)]
2. To censure her [A11 j (2)]
3. To fine her £100.00 [A11 j (3)]
4. To disqualify her from exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Kennel Club. If any person disqualified under this sub-paragraph shall attend any canine event whilst disqualified

the Board shall have the power to increase the period of disqualification [A11 j (4)]

5. To disqualify her from being or becoming a member of any canine club or society registered with or affiliated to the Kennel Club [A11 j (5)]
6. To disqualify her from acting as an officer or serving on the committee of any canine society [A11 j (6)]
7. To disqualify her from taking part in the management of any event licensed by The Royal Kennel Club [A11 j (7)]
8. To disqualify her from judging at any event licensed by the Kennel Club [A11 j (8)]

The suspensions and disqualifications are to be for the period of six (6) months from 25 September 2025.

The Committee, following the imposition of these penalties, would draw the attention of the Respondent to the effect of Rule A11 sub-sections I and n.

The Committee noted that the incident arose when an exhibitor called out Ms Culverhouse after she was heard making derogatory comments about the judge.

Ms Culverhouse then reacted to that challenge.

The Committee noted that Ms Culverhouse acknowledges that she had made a comment but that it had not been directed towards anyone and was not intended to have been overheard. Whether it was intended for people to hear or otherwise – the nature of the comment was unacceptable. The ensuing confrontation and verbal abuse towards another exhibitor exacerbated matters and the Committee does have to give reflection to the incident. The Committee noted that Ms Culverhouse explained that she had felt confronted by the exhibitor and made to feel defensive in the circumstances.

The penalty imposed is intended to reflect the abusive behaviour exhibited by Mrs Culverhouse was wholly unacceptable in the context of a Kennel Club licensed event.

The Committee wants to emphasise that disrespecting judges' decisions and confrontational behaviour should not be considered as standard or an acceptable way to engage with others at a licensed event. It is undermining of the whole ethos of Kennel Club licensed events which should be welcoming, supportive and encouraging for all. Respect, and adherence to proper standards of conduct is not optional but a fundamental requirement of participation. The Committee must take decisive and proportionate action to support and reflect this position.

Appeals Tribunal

Ms Dianne Culverhouse

Kennel Club Rule A11

24 October 2025

1. This is an appeal from the Disciplinary Committee decision of 25 September 2025.

The Committee upheld a complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Ms Dianne Culverhouse that she behaved discreditably or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in that she impugned the judge's decision and verbally abused and was threatening towards another exhibitor following

the judging of Lhasa Apso at Blackpool & District Canine Society Championship Show on 20 June 2025.

The Committee issued a warning, censure and imposed a fine of £100.

Disqualifications were imposed from canine activities including exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Kennel Club for period of six (6) months from 25 September 2025.

2. Ms Culverhouse was overheard saying the judge "needed to read the breed standard" as she left the ring. Ms Culverhouse maintained that this was not intended to be heard by others but the comment was overheard.

An exhibitor challenged Ms Culverhouse and she responded with verbal aggression and swearing – this caused distress to others and was disruptive and disturbing in the context.

3. Ms Culverhouse explained that she had felt threatened and confronted by the challenge. Ms Culverhouse apologised and takes responsibility for her actions.

4. The grounds raised for appeal by Ms Culverhouse are for the penalty to be reviewed in the light of the confrontational aspect of the approach towards her.

Ms Culverhouse had owned and apologised for the incident.

Ms Culverhouse has a significant and successful record for exhibiting, judging and serving on a breed committee.

5. The Disciplinary Committee made its views very plain; The Committee noted that Ms Culverhouse acknowledged that she had made a comment but that it had not been directed towards anyone and was not intended to have been overheard. Whether it was intended for people to hear or otherwise – the nature of the comment was unacceptable. The ensuing confrontation and verbal abuse towards another exhibitor exacerbated matters and the Committee does have to give reflection to the incident. The Committee noted that Ms Culverhouse explained that she had felt confronted by the exhibitor and made to feel defensive in the circumstances.

The penalty imposed is intended to reflect the abusive behaviour exhibited by Ms Culverhouse was wholly unacceptable in the context of a Kennel Club licensed event.

The Committee wants to emphasise that disrespecting judges' decisions and confrontational behaviour should not be considered as standard or an acceptable way to engage with others at a licensed event. It is undermining of the whole ethos of Kennel Club licensed events which should be welcoming, supportive and encouraging for all. Respect, and adherence to proper standards of conduct is not optional but a fundamental requirement of participation. The Committee must take decisive and proportionate action to support and reflect this position.

Observations and Outcome

1. The Appeals Tribunal did review the matter carefully and the level of penalty imposed by the Disciplinary Committee and was not of the view that it had been unreasonable and therefore did not require withdrawal or modification.

KC File for December

2. There was a clear acknowledgement of the incident and the comments made.

The Appeals Tribunal did not see any ground for appeal and accordingly the appeal is not upheld.

3. There needs to be a real paradigm shift in what has been considered as acceptable or tolerated behaviour and the margins of what is actually reasonable or unreasonable engagement. A very robust line is going to be taken when boundaries are crossed – to reflect real movement in the level of tolerance of activity which crosses a line.

Perceived provocation or confrontation of any kind should not be responded to; the only reaction must be to walk away and/or seek assistance of show management, which ought in all circumstances to be supportive and receptive to assisting in order to de-escalate any heated and confrontational situation.

4. The character testimonials were noted. The strength of individual relationships is understood and it is commendable that there is support for Ms Culverhouse including from breed clubs. Ms Culverhouse should consider this only as a pause in her otherwise successful competitive activities.

Kennel Club Rule A11

The Committee having carefully considered the evidence, find that the complaint brought under Kennel Club Rule A11 a (1) (b) against Mrs Michelle Kingsland namely that she behaved discreditably or prejudicially to the interests of the canine world in posting denigrating and undermining remarks on

social media directed at the selection of judges by the Crufts Committee, is upheld.

The Committee impose the following penalties:

1. To warn her as to her future conduct [A11 j (1)]
2. To censure her [A11 j (2)]
3. To disqualify her from exhibiting at, taking part in, attending and/or having any connection with any event licensed by the Kennel Club. If any person disqualified under this sub-paragraph shall attend any canine event whilst disqualified the Board shall have the power to increase the period of disqualification [A11 j (4)]
4. To disqualify her from being or becoming a member of any canine club or society registered with or affiliated to the Kennel Club [A11 j (5)]
5. To disqualify her from acting as an officer or serving on the committee of any canine society [A11 j (6)]
6. To disqualify her from taking part in the management of any event licensed by The Royal Kennel Club [A11 j (7)]
7. To disqualify her from judging at any event licensed by the Kennel Club [A11 j (8)]

The suspensions and disqualifications are to be for the period of six (6) months from 25 September 2025.

The Committee, following the imposition of these penalties, would draw the attention of the Respondent to the effect of Rule A11 sub-sections 1 and n.

The Committee noted that Mrs Kingsland had engaged respectfully with the investigation, acknowledging the complaint, apologising for the content and phrasing of her post and removing it from social media.

The Committee reviewed the social media

posting and noted the inferences in respect of the integrity of the members of the Crufts Committee in their selection and appointment of judges. Mrs Kingsland's post used the terms 'fixed', 'crooked' and 'unjust' to express her opinion that the Crufts Committee's selection process was unfair.

The Committee accepts that it is natural sometimes to feel frustration with and to have an opinion on the selection of judges for any event. Also, whilst fair comment and the freedom to express a personal opinion is recognised, the use of disparaging, rude and hurtful terms which cause upset are beyond the bounds of respectful engagement and must be addressed where appropriate.

Anyone committing opinion to social media including personal social media pages needs to appreciate that the expectation of privacy is negligible – posts may be commented upon, liked, screenshotted and/or shared. Comments and content on social media may be enduring. People need to accept that if they wish to create a written record of their opinions that this should be in terms that does not cause offence or issues and/or they must expect that at some point if a boundary is crossed – complaints may be made by those subject to such comments or opinions.

The Committee needs to highlight that use of language such as 'fixed', 'crooked', or 'unjust' is wholly inappropriate when commenting on the decisions of any Kennel Club Committee. This is particularly so where the individual is a Kennel Club approved Judge and therefore holds a position where they are expected to uphold the highest standards of integrity and respect.

Where such opinion is expressed but boundaries are crossed then this Committee must give the appropriate sanction.
